### **More virtues related to work ethics**

1. Responsibility – Owning your tasks and accepting the results of your actions. At work, it means reporting mistakes, fixing them and not blaming others.
2. Discipline – Managing time and behaviour to avoid laziness or distractions. It means going to work on time and staying focused.
3. Accountability – Being answerable to your employer, team and God for how you do your work.
4. Respect – Honouring your supervisors, coworkers and clients regardless of your position. It helps to avoid gossip and rudeness.
5. Service – Seeing work as serving God and people, not just yourself.
6. Compassion – Caring for coworkers who are struggling or overloaded. It also means helping without expecting pay back.
7. Perseverance – Continuing to do good work even when it is difficult or boring. Not giving up quickly.
8. Creativity – Using your God-given talents to find better, wiser ways of doing work.
9. Loyalty – Being faithful to your employer and organisation, protecting its reputation.
10. Justice – Treating everyone equally at work and not showing favoritism.

### **Careers you can pursue related to talents and abilities**

1. Technology and ICT – For those talented in computers, coding, problem-solving and digital creativity. For example, a software developer, graphic designer or cyber security expert.
2. Health and medicine – For example, nursing, pharmacy, physiotherapy or lab technology.
3. Business and finance – For example, accounting, banking, entrepreneurship and marketing.
4. Media and communication – For those with good speaking, writing or creativity skills. For example, journalism, public relations, film production or content creation.
5. Engineering and technical – For example, electrical, mechanical, civil or automotive engineering.
6. Law and governance – For example, a lawyer, magistrate, policy maker or human rights officer.
7. Environment and conservation – For example, wildlife management, forestry, environmental science and meteorology.
8. Tourism and travel – For example, a tour guide, hotel management or travel consultant.
9. Social work and counselling – For example, counselling psychology, social work or child protection.

10. Religious and community Service – For example, theology, pastoral work, mission work or community development.
